

Oscoda County District Library Cards

Library cards must be provided to staff to check out all Library material (including but not limited to: books, A/V, MelCat, and computers).

Regular Cards

Library cards are issued to residents and property owners of Oscoda County. When applying for a library card, individuals must show valid photo identification that lists a current address. Property owners may search <http://mi-oscoda-equalization.governmax.com/svc/default.asp?sid=16631D51043F491DB2F88FE4F0D12FDF> and print the information related to their property for verification purposes. These cards are valid for three years.

A parent/guardian may sign up their minor (under the age of 18) child for a Library card. The parent/guardian must have a valid Oscoda County Library card that is free from overdue material(s) and fines.

The replacement cost of lost library card will be \$1.00

Reciprocal Borrowing Cards

Library cards are issued to adult residents that are serviced by a library participating with the Northland Library Cooperative Reciprocal Borrowing Agreement. The only services not available to reciprocal borrowers are the interlibrary loan service (including borrowing through MelCat) and services that are limited to residents due to licensing restrictions (example: Overdrive, Hoopla, Freegal). Patrons should check with their home library for details on these services. Individuals must show valid photo identification that lists a current address. These cards are valid for one year.

The replacement cost of lost library card will be \$1.00

Visitor Cards

Library cards are issued to guests of Oscoda County. Individuals must show valid photo identification that lists a current address. These cards limit the user to use of the Internet and Overdrive/Libby and expire in three months.
